

SENSITIZATION PROGRAMME FOR POSTGRADUATES STUDENTS ABOUT THE CROCODILES OF GANGA RIVER ON THE OCCASION OF "WORLD CROCODILE DAY" ON 17TH JUNE 2017

DETAILED EVENT

As part of the NMCG-WII project "Biodiversity Conservation and Ganga Rejuvenation" under *Namami Gange* Programme, the team celebrated the "World Crocodile Day" on 17th June, 2017 at Malsi Deer Park (Dehradun Zoo). Around 55 participants were present in the programmes. An inter-Quiz competition programme between colleges of Dehradun was organized as part of this event on the theme: The Crocodile: Vahana of Vibrant Ganga. A total of five teams participated in the quiz programme. The quiz was conducted by Ms. Amanat Gill, Project Fellow of the project at the auditorium of the Dehradun Zoo. There were a total of four rounds of which the first round was qualifying test on 'classification, scientific and common names of Crocodiles, and IUCN status'. The other rounds were on Crocodile's population worldwide and in India, Distribution status, National Park famous for species, Morphology and physiological, Reproduction biology of the species. The activity started at 10:00 a.m. and continued till 12:00 p.m. The students and faculty of different colleges participated with great enthusiasm. Certificates for the winning teams were handed over by Dr. Sangeeta Angom, Training Coordinator, Biodiversity Conservation and Ganga Rejuvenation.

The purpose of this programme is to sensitize the students about the ecological significance, habitat and distribution of crocodiles of Ganga River and conservation issues associated therein. Among the team, the first prize was awarded to participants of Doon University, second was Dayanand Brijendra Swarup PG College, and third was Sardar Bhagwan Singh PG

Institute of Biomedical and Natural Sciences and consolation prize was given to Dolphin (PG) Colleges of Biomedical and Natural Sciences respectively. During the programme, a group of enthusiastic special kids from "SAAHAS FOUNDATION" has also participated and cheered up the teams of colleges.

The other rounds had questions on crocodile population worldwide and in India, their distribution status, national parks with crocodiles, morphology, physiology and reproduction of the species.
