XXXII Advanced Post-Graduate Diploma Course in Wildlife Management, September 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011. The participants of the course were taken for High Altitude Ecology Tour during October 22-28, 2010. They visited the Kedarnath Wildlife Sanctuary and Nanda Devi Biosphere Reserve and trekked from Chopta to Tungnath (3680 m above msl). They were fortunate to see elusive Bharals (Pseudois nayaur), Himalayan Tahrs (Hemitragus jemlahicus) and Gorals (Naemorhedus goral) during the tour.

The Techniques Tour was conducted at Sariska Tiger Reserve during December 5-24, 2010. The officer trainees got a first hand exposure to latest in camera traps

and radio telemetry. They also learnt various techniques such as line transects, vehicle based transects, block counts, pellet counts, bird counts and habitat mapping. The trainees also made a short visit to Keoladeo National Park, Bharatpur. The tour was completed with live demonstration of animal restraint techniques. The training course has been designed to achieve the objective of curbing illegal trade in Wildlife through

One-week training workshop on 'Role of Scientists in Biodiversity Conservation', Dehradun, October 25-29, 2010. Department of Science and

Technology (DST) has launched a scheme "National Training Programme for Scientists & Technologists working in Government Sector". As a part of this scheme, the DST has initiated training programmes exclusively for women scientists/technologists. The Institute has organized this one-week training workshop. The key objectives of the



workshop were to make the scientists aware of: (i) principles/approaches in Biodiversity Conservation; (ii) causes of decline in natural resources/habitats and species; (iii) good practices in Biodiversity Conservation; (iv) conservation issues in the field; and (v) to establish linkages and facilitate sharing of information among scientists. National Level Training Programme for Scientists and Technologists in Biodiversity Conservation, Dehradun, November 8-13, 2010. The Wildlife Institute of India organized the training programme in which thirteen scientists and technologists working in the Government departments, institutions and universities participated. The science involved in biodiversity conservation and management has developed manifold in recent years. One of the reasons for it, the rapid transformation of this field is due to the influence of technology. It is important that scientists involved in biodiversity conservation in the country are exposed to these innovative applications and societal needs and update themselves of the recent advances in the field.

This course has the following objectives: (i) to make fully aware scientists on principles/approaches in Biodiversity Conservation; (ii) to make them scientists aware of causes of decline in natural resources/habitats and species; (iii) to make them aware of good practices in Biodiversity Conservation; (iv) to establish linkages and facilitate sharing of information among scientists; (v) to reiterate their role in creation of baseline

National Training Workshop on 'Strengthening CITES Implementation Capacity to Ensure Sustainable Wildlife Management and Non-Detrimental Trade' in India, Dehradun, December 20-21, 2010. The training workshop was held at the Institute in collaboration with CITES Secretariat, Geneva and the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India. Various enforcement agencies such as Forest and Wildlife Managers, officials from Customs, and Scientists from various institutions including NGOs participated in the workshop.

The workshop assisted officials and scientists in fulfilling more effectively the obligations under the CITES and helped to ensure sustainable management of natural resources through well regulated trade for species of conservation concern. The participants



learnt the basic understanding of the obligations under the Convention and its procedures. The workshop also offered an introduction to a Non-Detriment Finding (NDF) and identification of species listed in the various Appendices of CITES. *Contact: ksivakumar @wii.gov.in*

Go4BioDiv International Youth Forum, Mt. Fuji, Nagoya, Japan, October 16 -29, 2010. Go4BioDiv is an international youth forum giving young people an opportunity to network with their peers from different cultural backgrounds, to work together drawing up proposals for the conservation of biological diversity and to present these ideas to the public. Go4BioDiv brought together 34 young adults from 23 different countries. Two participants from India participated in this forum: Shazia Quasin, representing Nanda Devi National Park and Valley of Flowers National Park World Heritage Sites and Dhritiman Das, representing Manas National Park World Heritage Site. The young people collectively shared their own experiences, challenges and threats concerning their sites. Vesna Vujicic-Lugassy, Chief of Communication, Education and Partnership Unit in the UNESCO World Heritage Center gave an overall introduction to World Heritage and Deputy Director General Bill Jackson of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) addressed the youth group on the role of IUCN with regards to World Heritage Sites.
